\$15,000 Amateur / \$35,000 Non-Pro

(NCHA Lifetime Earnings as per NCHA January 1, 2010)

2010 RULES & REGULATIONS

1. For any age horse of all breeds. All entrants must be designated a \$15,000 Amateur or \$35,000 Non Pro by NCHA rules and records. Riders must hold an NCHA Amateur and /or Non Pro Card. Rider earnings are as of January 1, 2010. (These earnings are not split like the \$50,000 Amateur Aged Event vs. weekend class earnings.)
2. Nomination fee: Due on or before March 5, 2010 \$295.
* Includes \$75 Entry Fee, \$150.00 cattle charge, \$35 P/C**, \$12 video fee, \$5 Drug Fee, \$10 Turnback Stall Fee, \$6 PCCHA Fee and \$2 NCHA Fee. Post entries \$50 and dependant on cattle availability.
3. The PURINA MILLS Series cutting will be one go round only and will be paid out according to the NCHA payout schedule.
4. Contestants may enter one horse per show.
5. The Top Five in each event will receive a Vogt buckle. The PURINA MILLS Series Champion in each division will receive a Vogt Buckle. In order to be eligible for the PURINA MILLS Series championship, contestants must compete in at least two of the three cuttings within the series. Champion will be determined by total money won, money will count on the rider.
6. All monies won will be submitted to NCHA as miscellaneous earnings.
7. Two and a Half (2 1/2) fresh head of cattle per horse will be used.
8. If there are any ties for the championship of a Pacific Coast event, the purse will be distributed 50/50. A work off will be held only to determine the recipient of the awards, if the competitors should choose.
9. The PCCHA Executive Committee reserves the right should it be deemed necessary, to make any changes or alterations to the above rules.
10. All Owners and Riders must be current PCCHA and NCHA members to compete.
