## Open Classic Challenge - 1<sup>st</sup> Go

The cool gray morning ushered in either a better herd of cattle than the previous morning's 1<sup>st</sup> set or, a tougher bunch of horses than Thursday's, because right off the bat, horses were scoring generally higher than in the Futurity. Of course the 5 and 6 year olds in the Open Classic Challenge are more mature and expected to be more solid competitors. They didn't disappoint as *Im Catman* (High Brow Cat X Cowstruck) ridden by Matt Budge from Weatherford, Texas and owned by Reata Cutting Horses LLC for Aubrey, Texas marked a 221 3<sup>rd</sup> out of the 1<sup>st</sup> set of cattle.

Clint Allen from Weatherford, Texas blasted out last in the 2<sup>nd</sup> set with a 222 showing on *Holly is Smooth*, a sorrel mare owned by Tommy Manion Inc. from Aubrey, Texas. Holly is Smooth is by Smooth as a Cat (High Brow Cat) and out of Holly Zack, a daughter of Zack

T Wood. Clint commented that he had only been riding her for 5 days. "Phil Rapp was supposed to show her, but he had back surgery. Matt Miller usually shows her. She's good. I've helped Matt a few times in

Texas, I knew her pretty well. I had some good cows for last in the herd. the last cow really built momentum & helped me finish."

As the day grew warmer, it seemed the cattle got testier. Many good horses were having exceptional runs only to be taken out by pushy renegade runners.

The 1<sup>st</sup> horse out in set 5 was *Jaebars Angel* ridden by Cookie Banuelos who was able to tie up the score with Clint Allen marking a solid 222 as well. *Jaebars*

*Angel* is a 6 year old sorrel mare by Smart Little Jaebars a son of Smart Little Lena, and out of Angels Little Gunner, a daughter of Young Gun. *Jaebars Angel* was bought by Cookie and his wife

Kate in Fort Worth, Texas as a yearling. Cookie, who is from Las Vegas, Nevada said that the mare "won the PCCHA 4 year old division year end award. I've been in a bunch of other finals on her." About his run today he added, "one of the deals is, the cattle are really tough today. I just hoped to get through. I caught 'em good. My horse is really good, so things worked out great thanks to my 4 good helpers (Tim Smith, Rock Hedlund, Todd Bimat, & Jason Haefner)!"

With just a half point trailing the two leaders, Phil Hanson from Prineville, Oregon rode *Lily Shea Rey* (Dual Rey X Lil Shea Lena) to a score of 221 1/2 for owners Butch and Wendy Johnson of Lehi, Utah.

Out of the 70 horses competing in this event, 49 advance to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Go slated for Saturday afternoon.

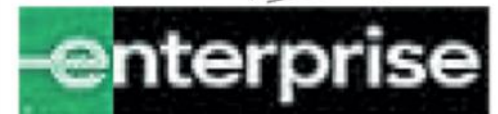

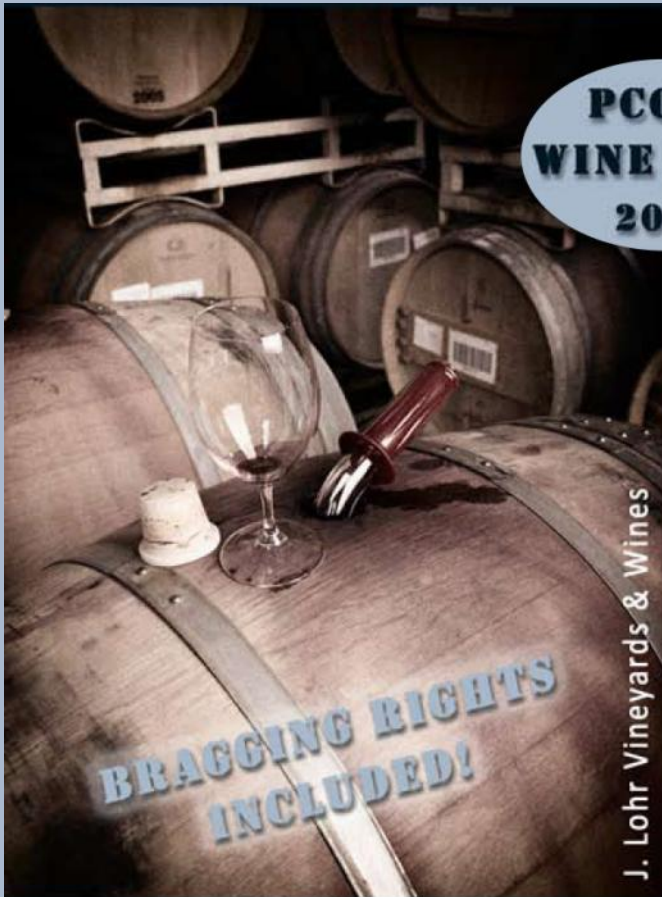

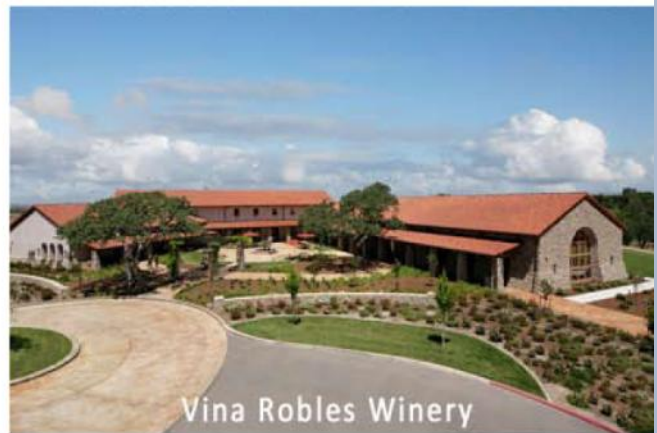

## The Intermediate Division

Pacific Coast Cutting Horse Association Vice-President and trainer Scott Weis took some time to explain the story of the Intermediate division of this year's Futurity. He made a big point of saying that the program is not about him. It was the brainchild of many cutting horse trainers who had the idea and put up the money. The idea was a process that took a couple of years. "It was turn back talk" he said. During the shows lots of riders chat about ways things could be better. A couple of years ago they had a meeting to "look for ways to improve our industry. There was also a meeting in Oregon and another one at Carol Ward's show in Rancho Murrieta, CA. They talked about wanting "to help stimulate our industry. The idea kept coming up that we need to encourage the young trainers who don't have a lot of horses in their barns. We need to give these guys a plan to show. The idea is to build a bigger and better cutting and help PCCHA maintain what we have and grow."

To be eligible for the Intermediate division, all riders have

to go in the Open Futurity. However, the Intermediate has a separate purse paid for by the trainers in the Gold Club. Each trainer puts up \$1000 that goes to the added purse just for the Intermediate riders. This way, if they don't make it in the Futurity, they still have a chance for the Intermediate purse money of \$20,000 added. They have chances to collect checks for the Open Futurity, which should be a significant payout, the Intermediate finals, and the top 34 of the Open Futurity. Riders for the Intermediate division may not have lifetime earnings over \$500,000.

Scott now challenges the Texas trainers to put in their \$1000 each. "We want people to give back."

*Cats Date*, ridden by Hayden Upton of Wilton, CA and owned by Forrest Saunders of Glen William, Australia is the current leader with a combined score of 432.5 from the 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> go rounds in the Intermediate division. *Alexas Dulee*, ridden by Eric Wisheart of Steamboat Colorado and owned by Galles Ranch of Albuquerque, New Mexico is second with a combined score of 432.
