Non Pro Futurity 2nd Go Round Highlight: Local Girl Shares Spotlight with Texan

The Golden Hills PCCHA Non Pro Futurity featured 28 entries, from which 22 advanced to the 2nd go round. 8 horses are then to advance to the Finals, which will be held Sunday, October 30.

Paso Robles resident Mary Kate Huntsberger had her local buddies in the stands egging her on in support on Tuesday's 2nd go round of the Non-Pro Futurity. Riding the 2nd horse in the 1st herd of the day, My Lil Lucky Duck (Blue Duck Okie out of a Docs Hickory daughter – Tachitas Hickory), Mary Kate marked a 216, which remained the high score throughout the go-round, although she had to share the honor with Jessica Gonsalves from Texas. Mary Kate said, "I love my horse and he tries for me every time I show him. He loves being a show horse, and knows the difference between the practice pen and the show pen."

Although Mary Kate's run tied with Jessica's 216, Jessica Gonsalves riding My Dads A Cat (WR This Cats Smart X Bodee Got Smart) earned the highest composite score of 435 for the 2 go-rounds. Jessica used to live

in Paso Robles, and now calls Millsap, Texas her home. My Dads A Cat cut deep turns particularly on the 2nd cow, which turned on the speed. The bell went off just as she was immersed in the herd trying to bring out a 3rd. Jessica tied for the high score in the 1st go-round with Carl Gerwien of Canada with a 219. So, Carl was right on her heels in this go with a 214, bringing his total score to 433 riding WS Catty Lil Taz (Pepto Taz X Cat Affair). WS Catty Taz showed off some smooth synchronized turns with a most impressive 1st cow. His

3rd cow was the fastest, but Carl held strong.

Simultaneously to the Non-Pro Futurity, the Non-Pro Futurity Gelding Stakes was being led by Jessica Gonsalves and her great little My Dads A Cat with her total going into the Finals of 435. Tracy Taylor on A Smokin Tomcat (Tomcat Chex by High Brow Cat, out of a daughter of Docs Gunsmoke called Peppys Smokin Edition) trails her in 2nd position with a total of 426. Only 5 geldings advance to the Finals.

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Making it happen

Carol Jenkins, the current President of the PCCHA, is a woman who is truly committed to the cutting horse industry and the Pacific Coast Cutting Horse Association. On being President this year, she smiled and remarked, "It's been a lot of fun. Anybody who participates should be involved with the Association. Until you've sat in that board meeting and looked at all the options, weighed in and out, you truly begin to appreciate the decisions the board makes." Carol knows that her perspective from behind the scenes has influenced her idea of how things ought to be. If you're not involved, it's certainly easy to criticize. In order to really make things better, giving back by serving on the board makes sense. And Carol gives back in a big way with her time. She is proud of the PCCHA and says that the "PCCHA is the biggest affiliate of the NCHA (National Cutting Horse Association). This Futurity is the 2nd biggest to Fort Worth in the United States. The PCCHA is a long time organization, and we put on a very consistent program in limited and aged events."

When asked what her goals are for this year, she thoughtfully said, "First, do no harm. There's no specific goal, but I try to meet whatever challenges come down the road. The economy is hard, but the numbers are strong. The change I'm most excited about is our new Intermediate class in the 3-year-old Open." The trainers developed, designed, and funded this program by themselves; a division within the annual Futurity for trainers who haven't reached the criteria. Twenty-

nine trainers so far have put up \$1000 each to

fund the program. Carol was thrilled to note that, "We have 31 riders here for the 1st year." What a great start to an innovative program!

Carol and her husband of 41 years both grew up in Fresno, CA. "I've always been horse crazy. My mom always said that I'd grow out of it, but I never did. "Carol got her 1st horse at the ripe young age of 10 and was "hooked forever." Her sister had a horse that she just took over. Again her mom thought it was a passing phase when she said to Carol, "You're going to meet boys and won't need that horse." She currently has at least 8 horses, so she apparently has proven her mother wrong.

Carol now resides in Brawley, CA, where she and her husband, Ross have lived for the past 25 years and raised their 3 kids. They put on 4 shows a year there in Brawley from November to March, before the heat of the summer season. Carol and Ross now have 2 grandchildren, which Carol says is "better than having kids!"

Carol wanted to be sure to give credit to her "great board" plus, Phil Benadum, PCCHA's head honcho, the wonderful office staff Debbie McGregor and Tammy Rodman, and all the volunteers. She says that "It is a collaborative effort running the organization."

Non Pro Cutting Stakes 1st Go Round Highlight: Donna Flanigan's Kool Run

This Kats Kool, ably ridden by Non-Pro rider Donna Flanigan, leads the 39 horse field of the Non-Pro Cutting Stakes 1st go round with a "Kool" score of 223. This Kats Kool (VWR This Cats Smart by High Brow Cat X Smoken C Starlight, a daughter of Charlies Starlight) is a 4 year old sorrel mare owned by Livermore, CA resident Donna Flanigan, who's uncle is "Uncle Burl." Uncle Burl owns Flanigan's Cowboy Stuff, one of the illustrious sponsors of this year's show. Donna raised This Kats Kool and said, "She's awesome! Thanks to Todd Bimat and Gavin Jordan for picking my cattle."

The number two spot was taken with a 222 by Gary Barker riding Reocy Moon (Cats Moonshine, a son of High Brow Cat, X Twice as Reocy by Dual Rey). Gary, who is from Oklahoma, also earned the top spot in the Gelding division of the Non-Pro Cutting Stakes. He

said, "Matt Gaines usually shows her and he said to buy her. I just started to show her. She has lots of expression." He then added, "Just go down, do your job, and she does hers." Reocy Moon and Gary also are leading the Senior division coming out of this go-round.

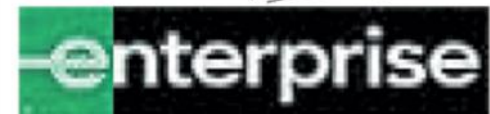
Shrimp Shack Shooter (Smooth As A Cat by High Brow Cat X Awesome Autumn, a daughter of Smart Little Lena) ridden by Mary Ann Rapp of Weatherford, Texas scored a 221 to place 3rd in this go-round. This score also put her in the lead in the Gelding division.

28 horses with a score of 203 or above advance to the 2nd go round of the Non Pro Cutting Stakes being held on Wednesday, October 26. Remember that the Cutting Stakes horses are all offspring of the Subscribed Stallions.

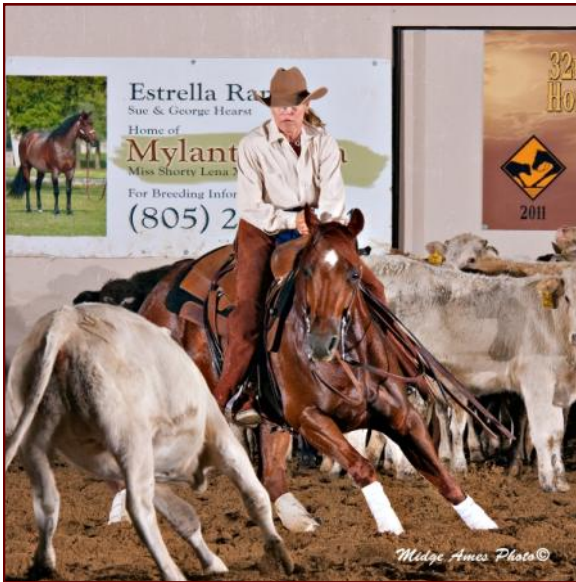


This Kats Kool ridden by Donna Flanigan

Non-Pro 5/6 & Gelding 1st Go Round Highlights: Roven of Reata Rocks Em!

On Tuesday, 51 horses competed for the Non-Pro 5/6 1st go round, while at the same time other categories were being rated. Stephanie Haymes – Roven of Reata Cutting horses LLC of Los Alamos, CA swept the 5/6 and the Gelding divisions. Stephanie jumped out 1st in the 2nd herd with the talented Im Catman (High Brow Cat X Cowstruck, a daughter of Smart Little Lena), marking a 222. Im Catman has already been shown this week so success-

fully by Matt Budge, winning the 5/6 Open Finals Championship on Monday, and collecting \$13,936. Stephanie rode 2 other horses in this event. She finally slowed down long enough after she showed her last horse to comment. About Im Catman, she said, "He's something" while shaking her head and smiling. "We raised him and Matt (Budge) trained him. He's 5 years old now. Next year, I'd like to try to make the top 15 of the Non-Pro."

Two horses later in the same herd, Kristen Galyean rode Harley (Spots Hot by Chula Dual X Cattilion, a daughter of High Brow Cat) to a sharp looking 219, which was matched by former Brazilian, now Texan Armando Costa Neto on Arosesuchaclatter (Smooth As A Cat by High Brow Cat X Mates Irish Rose by Smart Mate). When asked about the name Harley, Kristen said, "It was a nickname...a barn name. We wanted to name him Hot Harley, but the

name was taken. Harley was available in the registry. He's an exceptional horse. Every time I show him, he takes care of me. He does unique things expression-wise." Harley is a 5 year old gelding owned by Kristen and her husband/trainer, Wesley Galyean of Claremore, Oklahoma. Harley has been pretty busy garnering awards, such as winning the Super Stakes with Wesley aboard, and winning the Non-Pro Derby last year for Kristen.

In talking to Armando about Arosesuchaclatter, he was a man of few words, but said, "She's very good today. We cut some good cows." The 5 year old sorrel mare was trained by Roger Waggoner in Texas and is now with John Mitchell.

38 horses with scores of 206 and above advance to the 2nd go-round, to be held Wednesday, October 26.

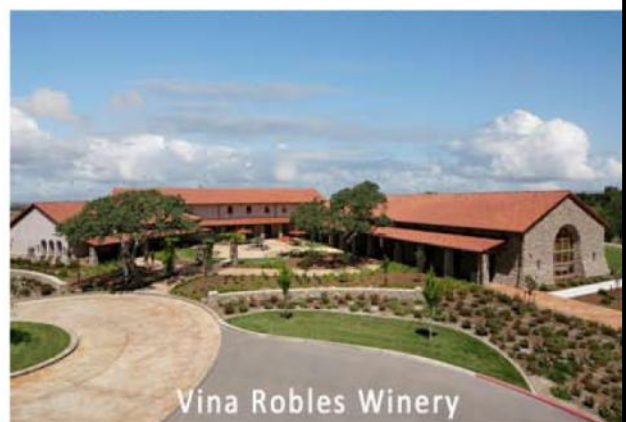
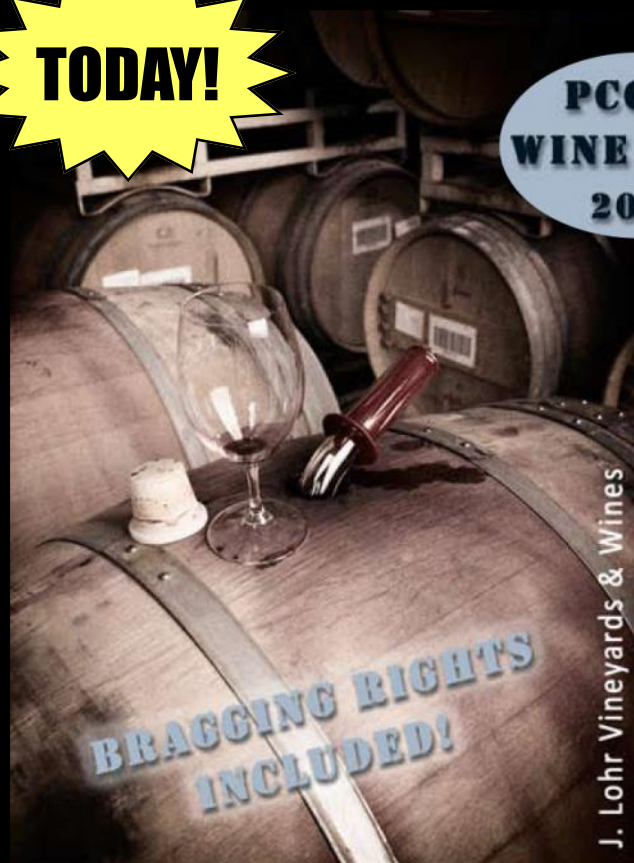
