PCCHA Open Futurity. Pouncin is by Highbrow Cat and out of Sneaking Up On You, by _____, a mare that Miller and the Kathy Foote had shown to success in earlier years. “This is the mare’s first colt,” said Miller. “It’s been fun to have this filly come along and perform as well as she is.” Pouncin was a finalist at both the NorthWest Futurity and Idaho Futurities will Miller aboard.

“She’s been real consistent,” added Miller. “We’re just real excited about her and I’m really looking forward to going on with her as a four-year-old.” It wasn’t until the last set of the day that Miller’s 218 bumped Morgan Cromer and CR Roan Ranger, owned by Eric Freitas, from what had been the leading score position. Cromer rode CR Roan Ranger, a _____ by _____, to a score of 217.5 as the fifth horse out in the fifth bunch.

Russ rode a total of four horses in the top fifteen scores of Open competition, but Pouncin emerged at the top thus far. “The cattle today were bigger steers and so some of them were tough to read,” said Miller of his seventh position work in the seventh and last set of the day. “Our first cow didn’t move a lot, but stayed real close in front of us and kept a lot of contact, which is real good for a three-year-old because they change so much from week to week. So after that first cow, I felt like she was really hooked up. My second cow was a real good cow that had a lot more move and was a little quicker and was able to let me expose her a little bit and show the talents that she has.”

Open Futurity competition continues Wednesday with continuation of the first go-round.
