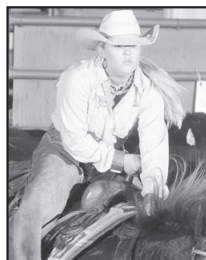
MEGAN MADGWICK



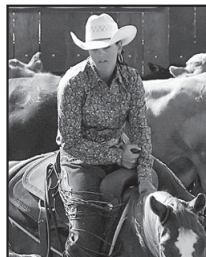
Megan, 18 is this years PCYCHA President. She has been very active with PCCHA Youth activities. Megan has been competing in PCCHA and NCHA cuttings
